Perseverance

In the beginning, miracles don't look like miracles; they look like problems, difficulties, uncertainties, failures, and pain. However, when our heart is in something, God has a way of turning our problems, difficulties, uncertainties, failures, and pain - into miracles. When our heart is truly in something, nobody can dissuade us or run us away from it. We simply cannot quit. However, when our heart ain't in something, (That's good English!) then one excuse to quit is just as good as another. Sometimes, the difference between failure and miracles can be summarized in one word:

Perseverance.

Speaking of perseverance, I am reminded of something Pastor Max McCord's daughter recently posted about him on Facebook. (More about this in a moment) Max is one of my Heroes of the Faith, I've known who he was for the vast majority of my life. However, I've gotten to know him on a much more personal level during the past twenty – twenty-five years. Some fifty-plus years ago, God selected Max to become the founding pastor of Rosemont Baptist Church in LaGrange, Georgia. Until just a few years ago, Max was the only pastor the church ever had. Max was at the helm as God grew the church from a handful of people meeting under his carport - to a church that averages well over 600 people in attendance

every Sunday. I'm positive that one word was prominent in this miracle: Perseverance!

Regarding the Facebook post I mentioned, his daughter posted: "My dad celebrated 63 years in the ministry yesterday. One day before this ministry anniversary, he was conducting a funeral - as beautifully as he ever has - with sincere and comforting love for the people he was serving - which has always been one of his greatest strengths. He sent our family this text this morning and I thought I would share it here and also convey to our church family how much his years in ministry mean to him still today: 'Hey Big Fam! Forgot to tell you yesterday, March 26, 1961, I was ordained to preach. 63 years ago! The ministry dominated our lives! I am grateful to Mimi and my 3 precious girls for their devotion and sacrifice! And it was a tremendous sacrifice! I love them for it and God does also! Just look at the kids He blessed us with! Love y'all!' We wouldn't trade the experiences we had for the world."

One phrase in Max's note captivated my attention: "... The ministry dominated our lives..." As he and his wife Marion started their journey under their carport with just a handful of people, it would have been hard to visualize a congregation averaging over 600 people in

attendance every Sunday. This miracle didn't start out looking like a miracle! When it started, it looked like problems, difficulties, uncertainties, failures, and pain. Oh, but when our heart is in something, God has a way of turning our problems, difficulties, uncertainties, failures, and pain into miracles. Nobody could dissuade him and Miss Marion, or run them away from it. They persevered!

Today, perseverance in both the church and the secular world is in short supply. The level of commitment Max spoke about when he said, "... The ministry dominated our lives ..." seemingly no longer exists today. I'm afraid ministry is now something we choose to do when we have nothing more important or pressing to do. I wonder exactly when we allowed the ministry to stop dominating our lives and become optional.

A successful ministry doesn't start out looking like a successful ministry. However, if our heart is in it, we will not allow anybody to dissuade us or run us away from it. But if our heart ain't in it - then one excuse to quit is just as good as another. Remember, sometimes the difference between failure and miracles can be summarized in one word: Perseverance.




