Things That Matter

"Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter." What a truth Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. articulated!
Meditate on it as you continue reading this column.

Perhaps as no other man in my lifetime, Dr. King had a unique understanding of things that mattered. Wisely, he concentrated all his talents and resources on those things. As a result, he changed the course of our nation. He identified and made the things that matter a priority in his life and gave no space for things that didn't. Conversely, I believe that as Christians and Americans today, unlike Dr. King, we have lost sight of the things that matter and have become "Masters of the Minutia," "Maintainers of the Mundane," and "Bloviators of the Irrelevant." Sadly, regarding things that matter, our moral and theological voices have grown eerily silent and we are no longer having the positive effect on society we once had.

Another great American, President Ronald Reagan said in a political speech, "I am impatient with those Republicans who after the last election rushed into print saying, 'We must broaden the base of our party' - when what they meant was to blur the differences between ourselves and our opponents.

Our people look for a cause to believe in. Is it a third party we need, or is it a new and revitalized second party, raising a banner of no pale pastels, but bold colors which make it unmistakably clear where we stand on all of the issues troubling the people?"

I believe as Christians we must realize that Americans are searching for something to believe in. So, as Ronald Reagan said, we should, "... raise a banner of no pale pastels, but bold colors which make it unmistakably clear where we stand on all of the issues troubling the people." We must again make our voices heard regarding things that matter.

If you remember nothing else you read in this column today, remember this: What one generation allows in moderation the next will practice in excess!

How did we get here? Here's an example: For those of you my age and older who have attended Southern Baptist Churches, I encourage you to look around your church sanctuary. Do you see a copy of The Church Covenant on the wall? You used to. However, because we have bought-in to the thought that the consumption of alcohol in moderation by Christians is okay – and because the Church Covenant contains "an inconvenient little line" that states we will abstain from the sale and use of alcohol as an

removed from the sanctuary wall and relegated to a closet somewhere.

And because we allow this in moderation, our children and grandchildren are practicing it in excess! Again, as Dr. King and President Reagan said, we must stop being silent about things that matter and paint with bold colors to make it unmistakable what we believe.

The greatest tenet of the Christian faith is that Jesus Christ is the only way to salvation. I heard a pastor friend, Rev. Lamar Womack, say in a sermon, "You can be a buddhist and never meet buddha; you can be a muslim and never meet mohammed; you can be a Catholic and never meet the Pope; you can be a morman and never meet Joseph Smith, but you cannot be a Christian without meeting Jesus Christ.

When we close our eyes in death the thing that will matter most is: "Do we know Jesus as our personal Savior?"

I believe the second may be: "Did we speak up regarding the things that matter?"

"Maintainers of the Mundane."

"Bloviators of the Irrelevant." God help us to find our voice regarding the things that matter. Why?

Because, "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter" and today that silence is deafening.






